Recipe Corner: **Cheesecake with Dark Chocolate**

Crust:

1 cup crushed nuts (walnuts or macadamias work best)	1/4 cup brown sugar
1 cup flour	1/2 cup butter (1 stick) softened

Combine all ingredients and press into a 9x9 baking dish. Bake 30 minutes at 325 degrees, then cool.

Filling:

1 cup heavy cream	1 tsp vanilla extract
1 pkg cream cheese (8 oz) softened	3 squares dark baking chocolate
1 cup sugar	

With an electric mixer, whip the heavy cream until it thickens. In a separate bowl, combine cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Fold whipped cream mixture into cream cheese mixture. Grate dark chocolate into mixture, reserving some for topping. Spoon mixture over crust, smooth with back of spoon and top with reserved grated chocolate. Refrigerate 1 hour before serving.

Close the Refrigerator!

Most of us often make a mistake that can spoil the food and spike the energy bill: We leave the refrigerator door open!

Here are some energy-saving tips that will keep your food fresh, your family healthier and your energy use under control.

- Before you place leftovers in the fridge, wrap them up. Raw meat and poultry can leak, and those juices can contaminate other food on lower shelves.
- Cool food on the counter before sticking it in the fridge. Hot food will raise the temperature inside the refrigerator.
- Fill your fridge so cold items can help keep other items cool. But don't stuff it. An overflowing refrigerator doesn't allow air to circulate between items, which tricks the unit into working harder and using more energy.
- Don't rely on your refrigerator to automatically set the temperature. Check it often so it stays at around 37 degrees.

Non-Residential Deposits

Delinquent nonresidential accounts without a continuing letter of guaranty from financial institution are required to pay a deposit equal to 25% of the delinquent bill. On 3rd consecutive delinquency, a deposit equal to 1/6th of the estimated annual billing will be assessed.

Residential Deposits

For residential consumers a deposit equal to 1/6th of the estimated annual billing is required if the account becomes delinquent three or more times in one year. After that year, the deposit may be refunded and applied to the next month's bill provided the account has not been delinquent in that year. If a service is disconnected, the deposit is applied to the final bill if all requirements have been met.
